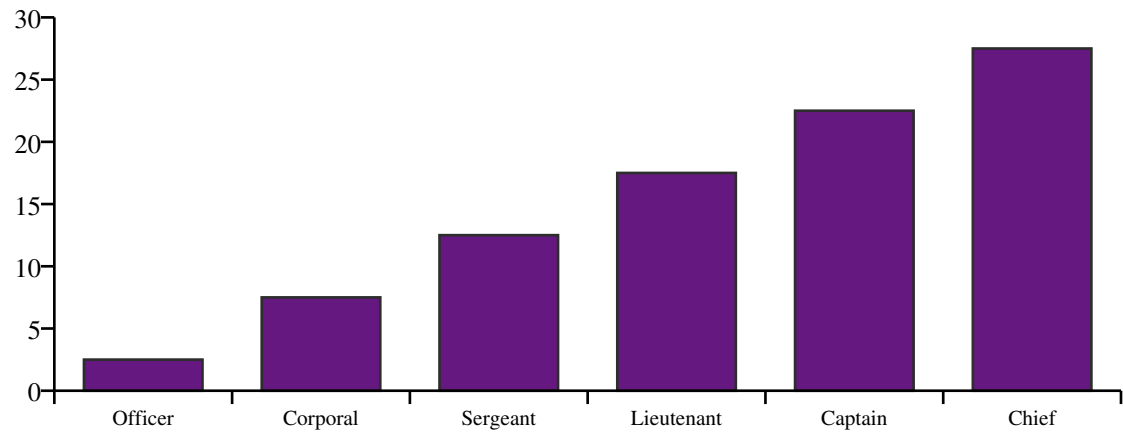

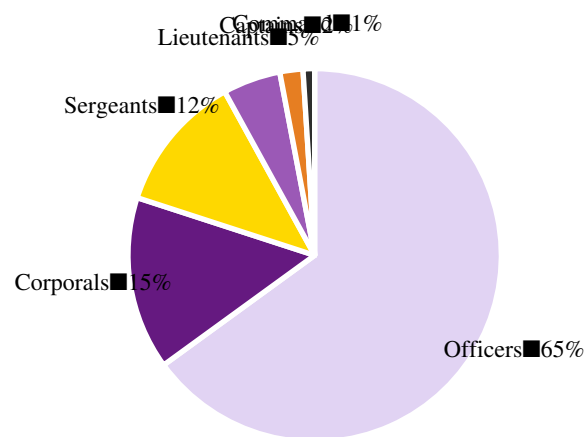
# LAW ENFORCEMENT CAREER STATISTICS

## TYPICAL DEPARTMENT RANK DISTRIBUTION

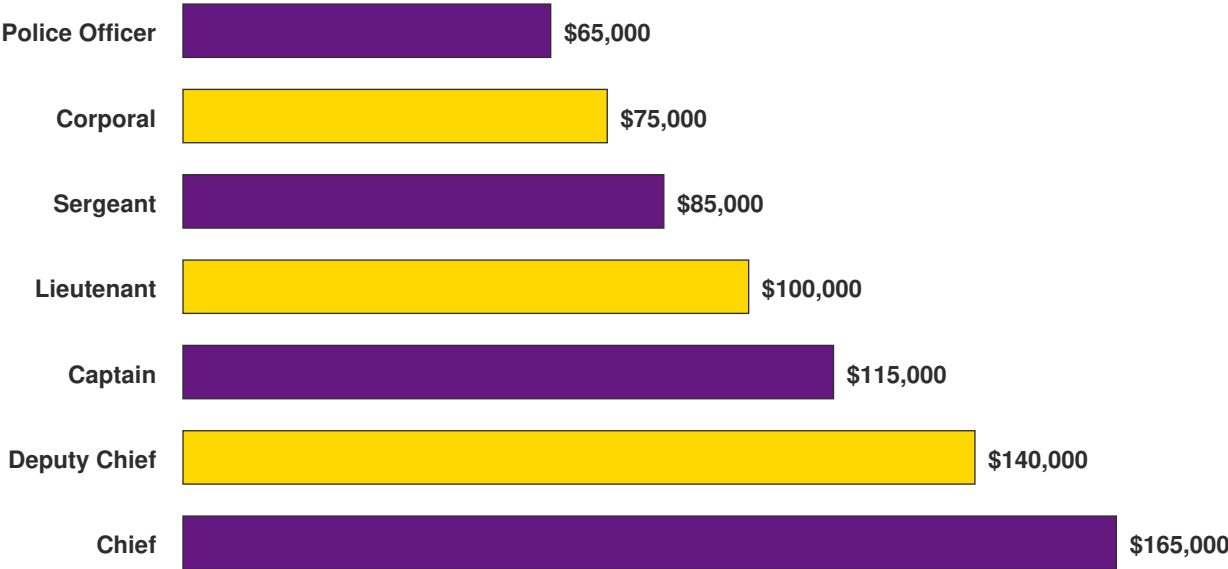


Average staffing ratios in U.S. municipal police departments

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# MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENT RANKS

# SHERIFF'S OFFICE RANKS

Sheriff's offices serve county jurisdictions and are typically headed by an elected sheriff. They often include law enforcement, jail operations, and court security responsibilities. View our [sheriff badges](#) collection.

# STATE POLICE / HIGHWAY PATROL RANKS

State police agencies have statewide jurisdiction and often use military-style rank structures. They focus on highway patrol, criminal investigations, and assisting local agencies.

# FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT RANKS

Federal agencies (FBI, DEA, ATF, U.S. Marshals) use unique rank structures with GS pay scales. Special Agents conduct federal investigations with nationwide jurisdiction. See our [federal agency badges](#).
